## Pay Attention at the Pump:

The rising price of gas has left independ-  
ent gas stations struggling to pay credit card  
transaction fees. Many stations are offering  
discounts to customers who pay with cash.

State law prohibits businesses from add-  
ing a surcharge to transactions when con-  
sumers pay with a credit card. They are,  
however, allowed to offer discounts to cus-  
tomers who pay with cash.

Motor fuel retailers must post highly visi-  
ble signs explaining the difference between  
cash and credit prices at street level and at  
the pump.

## Half Gallon Pricing on Older Gas Pumps

Some older, non-digital fuel pumps—less  
than 1%—cannot compute prices exceeding  
\$3.99. These stations must allow half-gallon  
pricing until upgrades are made.

To minimize the confusion that this  
change may cause to consumers, the Divi-  
sion of Standards recently sent written noti-  
fication to motor fuel dealers about the proce-  
dures for half-gallon pricing. Retailers with  
mechanical computers may set the price at  
one-half the posted retail price and double it  
to obtain the actual cost of fuel, provided that  
they have met the following conditions:

Replacement price computers have been  
ordered and a copy of the purchase order  
has been filed with the Division of Standards  
or the local weights & measures jurisdiction.  
Weather-proof signage no smaller than 6 x  
10 inches must be affixed to fuel dispensers  
informing consumers that the full-gallon price  
will be computed by doubling the price on the  
pump. Street signs must be conspicuously  
marked to indicate the terms of sale. If the  
sign refers to "cash only", that information  
must be clearly stated and at least one-half  
the size of the price that appears on the sign.

## Don't worry.

### There's still time to file for your economic stimulus payment.

Are you one of the many people who  
normally do not have to file federal in-  
come taxes because your income is quite  
low? This year it's different.

To receive an Economic Stimulus  
Payment, you should file Form 1040A  
with the IRS by October 15, 2008. This  
includes people who receive at least  
\$3,000 in earnings and/or benefits  
from Social Security, VA disability or a  
Retired Railroad Worker's pension.
