WEST NILE VIRUS



The Board of Health, for the purpose of surveillance for West Nile Disease, from now through the end of September would like to be notified if residents find a dead **crow or blue jay on their property**. Residents are instructed and encouraged to call the Board of Health (565-4140) and leave their name, address and phone. Residents who find dead blue jays or crows in the evening or during the weekend hours may wait until the next business day to call in their report. This is not an emergency requiring immediate assistance; however, the information is very important to bring to the Board of health's attention.

A Board of Health representative will return calls from residents, record surveillance information, and determine whether the bird can be accepted for testing by the Mass. Dept. of Public Health. The dead birds will not be tested in Boston if they are not in good condition or can not be tested within a few days of death. Any bird found on Friday afternoon, Saturday or Sunday would not arrive in Boston in a suitable condition to be tested. Birds found on residents' property on these days of the week should be double-bagged in plastic bags and disposed of in the curbside waste.
