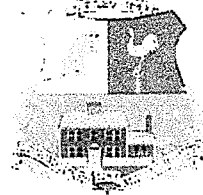

Instructions

1. Review attached Community Preservation Act (CPA) funding eligibility, selection criteria (Appendix), and application.
2. Prepare and submit 10 typed and double-sided copies of the application form and project description to the CPC, c/o the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, 20 Williams St., Longmeadow, MA 01106.
3. The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) will accept project proposals through the **first Monday in December** for possible consideration at the following Annual Town Meeting.
4. The CPC will review all applications by December 31 and schedule a meeting with each applicant to discuss its proposal.
 - a. The CPC may ask for more information before deciding to recommend the proposal for funding.
 - b. The CPC may request that you present your proposal at a public hearing.
5. If the project is selected for a funding recommendation, the CPC will submit it to Town Meeting.
6. Town Meeting has the sole authority to fund projects.

** Please note that the Committee reserves the right to modify these procedures and timeframe. Emergency applications will be accepted at the discretion of the CPC. The committee reserves the right to reject applications that are incomplete or late.*

Project Description

1. Goals:

Restore and preserve the building surrounding drive-way and parking area) of the building known as the American Legion Building and make the bathroom ADA accessible. The building dates from the mid 1800's and is the oldest town owned building. It was utilized for several uses throughout its existence including a school and town hall. The project will preserve the building exterior grounds further deterioration and allow town residents safe access to the American Legion Building.

2. Community need:

This building is known as the American Legion Building and is on the list of historic buildings on Longmeadow Street.

This project will restore the building exterior drive-way access and parking area to all Longmeadow residents as well as make the existing bathroom ADA accessible. Its use may potentially be expanded to store community historical data/documents which are currently stored in various inadequate Town locations. It could also function as a genealogical and history research center.

3. Community Support:

The Longmeadow Historical Society supports this project and welcomes the opportunity for the potential document depository and historical research center.

The Longmeadow Facilities Director also supports this project and has developed an RFP for the paving of both drive-way and parking lot serving the American Legion Building and has provided an estimate for the bathroom renovation.

Several other groups have offered support for the project including: Planning Board, Historical Society Curator and Veterans Agent.

4. Action & Timeline:

It is expected that the paving project will be completed by mid-summer and will complete the entire American Legion Building restoration which was started and approved at Town meeting in 2010.

5. Maintenance

There will be little or no maintenance required for several years and the work will be covered by warranty.

6 Preservation

There are no new deed requirements for this CPA project since both the land and building are Town owned.

Additional Information

A. This paving project will not violate any current zoning ordinances since it is merely replacing the existing paved surfaces.

B. There are no known hazardous materials on the site.

C. Request for quotes will be processed in accordance with the RFQ standard requirements.
