

MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 8, 2007 MEETING

A meeting of the Longmeadow Conservation Commission was called to order at 7:07 PM on August 8, 2007, in the conference room of the Longmeadow Police Station.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Albert Laakso, Scott Foster, Stephen Gazillo, Peter Bouvier and Karen Chadwell. Absent: John Bresnahan & Jim Simon.

OTHERS PRESENT: See attached.

MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING: The minutes of July 25, 2007, were accepted as amended.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Salary account, \$5653.30; Maintenance account, \$500.00; Misc. account, \$486.00. Treasurer's report was accepted.

7:10 PM: RDA – 74 DUNN ROAD – Christine & Matthew Regan presented a Request for Determination of Applicability to install a 1" type K copper water line from the street curb to their house. The trench will be 61' long and 5'6" deep. Excavation Plus, Inc. of Hampden will do the work. Although the home is in a priority habitat, it is exempt from MESA (Mass. Endangered Species Act) due to the installation of a water line. A motion was made and passed to issue a Negative Determination of Applicability.

OTHER BUSINESS: The Commission signed off on an Emergency Order issued to 227 Wimbledon Road due to storm water damage on the property. A Certificate of Compliance was issued to 111 Woodsley Road as repairs to drains and pipes were completed.

Al Laakso suggested that the secretary refer to the NOI log and send letters to residents who have not recorded their Certificates of Compliance, possibly going back 10 years.

Scott Foster reported that there has been theft of many vegetables from the community gardens on the Pomeroy plot. This was reported to the police department.

Al reported that there is a group of model airplane enthusiasts from Longmeadow interested in the Conservation farmland; they may come before the CC in September.

The meeting adjourned at 7:47 PM.
