

On September 16, 1977 our late father, John H. Breck, Jr. and his business partner, Jacob Levine, sold several acres of land along Wolf Swamp Road to the Town of Longmeadow. The deed specifically stated that the land was to be held by the town for "Conservation and Recreation Purposes". It has been brought to our attention that the town now wishes to use the land for a Department of Public Works facility.

As the surviving son and daughter of John H. Breck, Jr., we respectfully object to the proposed change in the use of the land.

Our father lived in Longmeadow for over 45 years and was devoted to its traditions and character which was the reason why he wanted the land used for conservation and recreation purposes. We believe the town should abide by the deed and honor the wishes of our father and Mr. Levine.
